Eagles Nest: 24-hours a day, 7 days a week, support to 2 individuals. Core funding provided by Community Living BC (CLBC)



COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

The Community Based Services (CBS) program provides one-to-one and group support to children and adults with disabilities and their families through a variety of programs. Our community support workers assisted children and youth from age 6 - 18 and adults age 19 - 78 in 2023/2024 fiscal year. They worked with individuals to focus on life skill development in areas identified by the participants and/or their support network.







INFORMATION & ADVOCACY PROGRAM

Our Information and Advocacy Program provides information and assistance to people with disabilities, their caregivers and families. Often the first point of contact for families and caregivers, our program extends beyond the North Shore with families reaching out to us to find services in their area. This past year, we have seen a large increase in contact and participation. Up 34%, we assisted almost 1,300 participants in various areas of the Information and Advocacy Program.



INFORMATION & ADVOCACY PROGRAM

Our advocates work with participants and families to provide information and apply for a wide range of disability benefits. They advocate for any applications that have been denied.

C I am writing to express my appreciation for the North Shore Disability Resource Centre's Information and Advocacy program. This past spring I received notice that my application for CPP disability benefits was denied. I was very disillusioned with the process and worried about my future because I have a serious medical condition that makes it impossible for me to work.

The government gave me a limited time to appeal the decision so I contacted the NSDRC and spoke to an advocate who, for no charge, confidently pursued the reconsideration appeal on my behalf. In the end, my appeal was successful and I was granted disability benefits which was a huge relief for me. There is no way I could have done it all by myself. The NSDRC's Information and Advocacy program is a vital service for people like me in the community.
